Explain the different sources of funding available to them to pay for training during and after high school.

Introduction

It’s important for students to earn credentials after high school—whether it’s technical certification and/or a diploma—but sometimes students drop out of training programs because they run out of money. The following are some resources students should be aware of to help avoid that problem.

Funding usually comes from a variety of sources, but students may not be aware of that.

They also may not be aware that getting **some** type of credential beyond a high school diploma is a really smart move.

Students should also know that the **military** offers money for schooling, but requires you to enlist on either a part-time or full-time basis.

If students choose to learn a trade, they can work as an **apprentice** and get paid as they grow their knowledge in the field.
